Whooping Cough Day 8 November

Western Australia is experiencing a surge in pertussis (whooping cough) cases. Whooping cough can be fatal in infants and can cause serious illness in older children and adults.

Providers are encouraged to check if patients are up to date with whooping cough vaccination and to highlight the importance of adult, pregnancy and childhood protection.
