

# Closure of Main Entrance and Piazza at Sir Charles Gairdner Hospital

#### **Facts and Questions**

## Why are there works happening on the main entrance?

The works form part of the works on the SCGH Emergency Department, which includes a new canopy across the piazza to the main entrance to provide shelter to patients, staff and visitors.

## How do we access Sir Charles Gairdner Hospital during the works?

You can access the hospital via E Block or other existing <u>entrances</u>. Parking directly outside the main entrance in the piazza will be unaccessible during works.

New signange has been installed and a reception desk opened inside the E block entrance to provide information and assistance.

# Where do I park at Sir Charles Gairdner Hospital during the works

Parking is available from the multideck carpark accessible off Winthrop Avenue. See QEIIMC | Visitor Parking Rates.

There will be a limited number of marked 15-minute visitor/patient drop off bays, accessibility bays and emergency vehicle and (ambulance, police) bays set up adjacent to the Piazza, while it is closed for the works.

# What if I am catching public transport to the hospital

There is no change to the bus timetable arriving to and from Sir Charles Gairdner Hospital during the works. A temporary bus stop has been created for bus 950 on Hospital Avenue, which is located in front of B Block on Hospital Avenue.

# What if I want to catch a taxi or Uber outside the hospital?

Dedicated taxi call buttons and numbered pickup points have been installed across the Queen Elizabeth II Medical Centre campus. A taxi sign with QR codes is displayed at each pickup location for walk-up passengers to call a taxi. There is a pick up point outside the E Block entrance.



## When will these changes be in place?

The works begin on Monday 3 November and will continue for an extended period of time.

# Why is the closure happening?

Redevlopment works on the SCGH main entrance have begun in order to expand and enhance the delivery of emergency services at SCGH to meet the needs to Western Australia's growing community.

The redevelopment project will be undertaken in multiple stages to minimise the impact on the Emergency Department and surrounding facilities.

A temporary closure to the main entrance and piazza is required for these works to take place.
